KATHRYN LOEW

Kathryn Loew graduated with distinction from the University of Michigan, where she was elected to Phi Beta Kappa and Pi Kappa Lambda, and was awarded the Albert Stanley Medal as the outstanding senior in the music school. She did additional graduate work at the School of Sacred Music of the Union Theological Seminary in New York City.

Mrs. Loew has been dean of the Southwestern Michigan Chapter of the American Guild of Organists, organist for the Kalamazoo Bach Festival, lecturer in organ at Kalamazoo College, and is organist and director of music at the Zion Lutheran Church in Kalamazoo. This season she was one of the organists in the inaugural organ recital series opening the new organ at Western Michigan University Auditorium.

THE DUNNING MEMORIAL CHAPEL ORGAN

This new instrument was built by M.P. Moller, Inc., of Hagerstown, Maryland, and installed in the chapel during the first three months of 1969, following the renovation of the chapel. The detailed specifications were prepared by Miss Miriam Bellville, Alma College Organist and Dr. James Upton, formerly of the Alma College music faculty, in consultation with Mr. Henry Beard of the Moller staff.

The organ comprises the four division of Great, Swell 1 and 11, Positiv, and Pedal, playable from the three-manual console. Within these divisions are 51 ranks, with almost 3,000 pipes. The resources and design of the organ make it suitable for the performance of the organ literature of contrasting periods and styles and at the same time provide for the flexibility necessary for chapel services.
